James said the duo's arrival would provide a knockout combination for the titles which have already attracted a 12-strong Papua New Guinea Olympic boxing training squad which will arrive fresh from an impressive performance at the Ocenia Games in Sydney.

"This will be one of the biggest tournaments the club has hosted because of the nature of the event which will have international fighters," he said.
